

Year 6 revision homework

Please find below a list of the homework activities that will be assigned each week. Each child will be given a bag containing a range of workbooks and an information book which includes helpful tips and reminders. **The children will be set the homework on the Monday listed and will mark their homework in school on the following Monday.** We will be using the workbooks during the week so it would be helpful if children could have these in school as much as possible. We will be encouraging the children to be responsible for remembering to bring their homework in to be marked every Monday.

We are more than happy to help with any tricky questions during the week. If your child is finding something challenging, please encourage them to speak to us as we are more than happy to work through any questions in school.

Each week, the homework activities will consist of the following:

1. Approximately two pages from the maths workbook
2. A ten-minute test activity

The ten-minute test workbooks are a great way to help children develop their time management. They should assign themselves 10 minutes to try and complete as many questions as they can. It is perfectly okay if they don't finish every question but we do encourage children to go through and pick out the questions they can do first, and then go back and do any trickier ones. Hopefully, as they become more familiar with the activities, they may be able to get more questions done in the time. If the time pressure is challenging for your child, they are very welcome to complete the test in as much time as they need and then introduce the 10-minute deadline once they feel more confident.

Please reassure the children that there may be some topics that we still need to teach across the spring term and they are always very welcome to bring the homework in to school for us to help them. We also understand that all children learn differently, and if you feel that the homework is too overwhelming for your child, please encourage them to complete what they can. We are trying to increase the children's experience of homework in preparation for secondary school but we also understand that there may be a reason why children are unable to complete a task, such as due to other commitments outside of school.
