

Privacy Notice (How we use School Workforce Information)

High Hesket Church of England School is committed to protecting the rights and privacy of individuals in accordance with its legal obligations under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). High Hesket Church of England School is registered with the Information Commissioner's Office as a Data Controller Registration Number: Z6913437

The categories of school information that we process include:

- personal information (such as name, employee or teacher number, national insurance number);
- characteristics information (such as gender, age, ethnic group)
- contract information (such as start dates, hours worked, post, roles and salary information);
- work absence information (such as number of absences and reasons);
- qualifications (and, where relevant, subjects taught);
- Relevant medical or disability information (such as access arrangements, medication and occupational health reports);
- Payroll information (such as address, age, gender, bank account details);
- Pension details.

Why we collect and use workforce information

We use workforce data to:

- Ensure we can operate efficiently and effectively;
- Enable individuals to be paid
- Allow for better financial modelling and planning;
- Enable the development of a comprehensive picture of the workforce and how it is deployed;
- inform the development of recruitment and retention policies;
- to keep the workforce safe (food allergies, or emergency contact details)
- to meet the statutory duties placed upon us for DfE data collections

Under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the legal bases we rely on for processing personal information are:

- 6(1)(b) to enter into or carry out a contract e.g. to employ people or buy services.
- 6(1)(c) to comply with the law e.g. pre-employment criminal record checks, recording sickness absence for benefits purposes, data sharing with child protection partners like social care, the NHS and the Local Authority etc.
- 6(1)(a) & 9(2)(a) having consent e.g. using images and names publicly, or referral to occupational health services.

When we process sensitive personal data like medical information we rely on the lawful bases:

- 9(2)(h) for preventative or occupational medicine or to assess the work capacity of an employee;
- 9(2)(i) to improve public health e.g. we report contagious infections (COVID-19) to Local Authority Public Health, District Council Environmental Health Departments and Public Health England as required.
- 9(2)(f) to defend a legal claim against us e.g. some special educational needs records and all accident records etc.

Collecting workforce information

We collect personal information via registration forms at the start of the contract of employment, which is updated as advised/necessary/relevant.

Workforce data is essential for the school's/local authority's operational use. Whilst the majority of information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with GDPR, we will inform you at the point of collection, whether you are required to provide certain information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing workforce information

We hold data securely for the set amount of time shown in our data retention schedule. For more information on our data retention schedule and how we keep your data safe, please visit

All records will be kept securely at all times. Paper records will be kept in lockable storage and all data stored electronically will have appropriate levels of security.

Who we share workforce information with

We routinely share this information with:

- our Local Authority – Cumbria County Council (where applicable)
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- Other schools or organisations following reference requests
- Other public services that have a lawful right to collect workforce information
- Payroll provider
- Occupational Health and similar staff support services only with the consent of the individual
- Cumbria County Council, the NHS, District Councils (Environmental Health) and Public Health England in order to support COVID-19 testing, contact tracing and outbreak management.

Why we share school workforce information

We do not share information about workforce members with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Local authority

We are required to share information about our workforce members with our local authority (LA) under section 5 of the Education (Supply of Information about the School Workforce) (England) Regulations 2007 and amendments. Data is provided in an electronic format, via a secure portal system.

Department for Education (DfE)

The Department for Education (DfE) collects personal data from educational settings and local authorities via various statutory data collections.

We are required to share information about our school employees with our local authority (LA) and the Department for Education (DfE) under section 5 of the Education (Supply of Information about the School Workforce) (England) Regulations 2007 and amendments.

All data is transferred securely and held by DfE under a combination of software and hardware controls which meet the current government security policy framework.

Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation, you have the right to request access to information about you that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, contact Mrs E McCullough, Data Manager, High Hesket Church of England School, High Hesket, Carlisle, CA4 0HU. If we are unable to supply you with the required information you will be told why.

You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress;
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing;
- object to decisions being taken by automated means;
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- a right to seek redress, either through the ICO or through the courts

How Government uses your data

The workforce data that we lawfully share with the DfE through data collections:

- informs departmental policy on pay and the monitoring of the effectiveness and diversity of the school workforce
- links to school funding and expenditure
- supports "longer term" research and monitoring of educational policy

Data collection requirements

Sharing by the Department

The department may share information about school employees with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children or the effective deployment of school staff in England by:

- conducting research or analysis;
- producing statistics;
- providing information, advice or guidance.

The department has robust processes in place to ensure that the confidentiality of personal data is maintained and there are stringent controls in place regarding access to it and its use. Decisions on whether DfE releases personal data to third parties are subject to a strict approval process and based on a detailed assessment of:

- who is requesting the data;
- the purpose for which it is required;
- the level and sensitivity of data requested; and
- the arrangements in place to securely store and handle the data.

To be granted access to school workforce information, organisations must comply with its strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of the data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.
