<ul> <li>Draw lines of varying thickness</li> <li>Use dots and lines to demonstrate pattern and texture</li> <li>Use different materials to draw, for example pastels, chalk, felt tips</li> <li>Begin to understand the proportions of the human face</li> <li>Key vocabulary: portrait, self-portrait, detail, line, bold, size, space, proportion, feature.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Experiment with showing line, tone and texture with different hardness of pencils</li> <li>Use shading to show light and shadow effects</li> <li>Use different materials to draw, e.g. pastels, chalk, felttips</li> <li>Show an awareness of space when drawing</li> <li>Begin to understand how shading and perspective can create a 3d illusion</li> <li>Understand how to shade and blend to create different effects</li> <li>Key vocabulary: surrealism, abstract, light, dark, tone, shadow, line, pattern, texture, form, shape, blend,</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Use a variety of techniques to add effects, e.g. shadows, reflection, hatching and cross-hatching</li> <li>Depict movement and perspective in drawings</li> <li>Use a variety of tools and select the most appropriate</li> <li>Key vocabulary: line, texture, pattern, form, shape, tone, smudge, blend, mark, hard, soft, light, heavy, mural, fresco, portrait, graffiti.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Name the primary and secondary colours</li> <li>Experiment with different brushes (including brushstrokes) and other painting tools</li> <li>Mix primary colours to make secondary colours</li> <li>Add white and black to alter tints and shades</li> <li>Key vocabulary: primary colours, secondary colours, tints, shades, warm colours, cool colours, watercolour wash, sweep.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Use varied brush techniques to create shapes, textures, patterns and lines</li> <li>Mix colours effectively using the correct language, e.g. tint, shade, primary and secondary</li> <li>Create different textures and effects with paint</li> <li>Key vocabulary: colour, foreground, background, blend, mix, line, tone, pointillism, landscape.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Create a colour palette, demonstrating mixing techniques</li> <li>Use a range of paint (acrylic, oil paints, water colours) to create visually interesting pieces</li> <li>To understand the term typography and how lettering is chosen for different purposes</li> <li>To explore how to use negative and positive space to create a simple image</li> <li>Key vocabulary: typography, stencil, composition, mural, fresco, graffiti, arrange, fix, negative space, positive space,</li> </ul>
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3d / Sculpture	<ul> <li>Use a variety of natural, recycled and manufactured materials for sculpting, e.g. clay, straw and card</li> <li>Use a variety of techniques, e.g. rolling, cutting, pinching</li> <li>Use a variety of shapes, including lines and texture</li> <li>Key vocabulary: sculpture, statue, model, 3D, carving,</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Cut, make and combine shapes to create recognizable forms or images</li> <li>Use a variety of materials and combine in different ways</li> <li>Use materials other than clay to create a 3D sculpture Key vocabulary: sculpture, statue, brim, peak, edging, trimmings, peak, edging, trimmings, shape, form</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Plan and design a sculpture</li> <li>Use tools and materials to carve, add shape, add texture and pattern</li> <li>Develop cutting and joining skills, e.g. using wire, coils, slabs and slips</li> <li>Key vocabulary: form, structure, texture, shape, mark, soft, join, coil, slab, slip</li> </ul>
Collage / textiles	<ul> <li>sculpture, installation, shapes, joining, form, texture.</li> <li>Use a combination of materials that have been cut, torn and glued</li> <li>Sort and arrange materials</li> <li>Add texture by mixing materials</li> <li>Decorate textiles with glue or stitching, to add colour and detail</li> <li>Key vocabulary: collage, cut, place, arrange, textiles, fabric, decoration.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Select colours and materials to create effect, giving reasons for their choices</li> <li>Refine work as they go to ensure precision</li> <li>Learn and practice a variety of techniques, e.g. overlapping, tessellation, mosaic and montage</li> <li>Select appropriate materials, giving reasons</li> <li>Use a variety of techniques, e.g. weaving and stitching to create different textural effects</li> <li>Develop skills in stitching, cutting and joining</li> <li>To be able to create pattern and images through weaving</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Add collage to a painted or printed background</li> <li>Use a range of mixed media</li> <li>Experiment with a range of media by overlapping and layering in order to create texture, effect and colour</li> <li>Key vocabulary: shape, form, arrange, fix, colour, pattern, overlapping, layering.</li> </ul>
Printing / pattern	<ul> <li>Understand the term 'printing' and to be able to print using a variety of materials, e.g. sponges, fruit, blocks</li> <li>Demonstrate a range of techniques, e.g. rolling, pressing, stamping and rubbing</li> <li>To understand that a relief image is made when we print from a raised surface</li> <li>To understand that prints are made by transferring an image from one surface to another</li> <li>To be able to create their own simple printing block</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Design and create printing blocks/tiles</li> <li>Develop techniques in mono, block and relief printing</li> <li>Create and arrange accurate patterns</li> </ul> Key vocabulary: composition, printmaking, pattern, shape, tile, colour, arrange, block, relief, monoprint
