## Exploring, <br> developing and <br> evaluating ideas

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Drawing point, observe, focus, design, improve,
composition.

- Draw lines of varying thickness
- Use dots and lines to demonstrate pattern and texture
- Use different materials to draw, for example pastels, chalk, felt tips
- Begin to understand the proportions of the human face

Key vocabulary: portrait, self-portrait, detail, line, bold, size, space, proportion, feature.

- Name the primary and secondary colours
- Experiment with different brushes (including brushstrokes) and other painting tools
- Mix primary colours to make secondary colours
- Add white and black to alter tints and shades

Key vocabulary: primary colours, secondary colours, tints, shades, warm colours, cool colours, watercolour wash sweep.

- Use sketchbooks to record ideas
- Explore ideas from first-hand observations;
- To reflect upon their work and adapt and refine ideas

Key vocabulary: composition, record, detail, question, observe, refine.

- Experiment with showing line, tone and texture with different hardness of pencils
- Use shading to show light and shadow effects
- Use different materials to draw, e.g. pastels, chalk, felttips
- Show an awareness of space when drawing
- Begin to understand how shading and perspective can create a 3d illusion
- Understand how to shade and blend to create different effects

Key vocabulary: surrealism, abstract, light, dark, tone, shadow, line, pattern, texture, form, shape, blend, perspective.

- Use varied brush techniques to create shapes, textures, patterns and lines
- Mix colours effectively using the correct language, e.g. tint, shade, primary and secondary
- Create different textures and effects with paint

Key vocabulary: colour, foreground, background, blend, mix, line, tone, pointillism, landscape.

- Review and revisit ideas in their sketchbooks
- Offer feedback using technical vocabulary
- Think critically about their art and design work
- Use digital technology as sources for developing idea

Key vocabulary: sketchbook, develop, refine, observe, respond, evaluate.

- Use a variety of techniques to add effects, e.g. shadows, reflection, hatching and crosshatching
- Depict movement and perspective in drawings
- Use a variety of tools and select the most appropriate

Key vocabulary: line, texture, pattern, form, shape, tone, smudge, blend, mark, hard, soft, light, heavy, mural, fresco, portrait, graffiti.

- Create a colour palette, demonstrating mixing techniques
- Use a range of paint (acrylic, oil paints, water colours) to create visually interesting pieces
- To understand the term typography and how lettering is chosen for different purposes
- To explore how to use negative and positive space to create a simple image

Key vocabulary: typography, stencil, composition, mural, fresco, graffiti, arrange, fix, negative space, positive space, colour palette, mix, tone, pop art, contrast, digital, effect.

3d / Sculpture

Key vocabulary: sculpture, statue, model, 3D, carving, sculpture, installation, shapes, joining, form, texture.

- Use a combination of materials that have been cut, torn and glued
- Sort and arrange materials
- Add texture by mixing materials
- Decorate textiles with glue or stitching, to add colour and detail

Key vocabulary: collage, cut, place, arrange, textiles, fabric, decoration.

- Understand the term 'printing' and to be able to print using a variety of materials, e.g. sponges, fruit, blocks
- Demonstrate a range of techniques, e.g. rolling, pressing, stamping and rubbing
- To understand that a relief image is made when we print from a raised surface
- To understand that prints are made by transferring an image from one surface to another
- To be able to create their own simple printing block

Key vocabulary: colour, shape, printing, printmaking, relief printing, objects, geometric.

- Describe the work of famous, notable artists and designers
- Express an opinion on the work of famous, notable artists
- Use inspiration from famous, notable artists to create their own work and compare


## Work of other

 artists- Cut, make and combine shapes to create recognizable forms or images
- Use a variety of materials and combine in different ways
- Use materials other than clay to create a 3D sculpture

Key vocabulary: sculpture, statue, brim, peak, edging trimmings, peak, edging, trimmings, shape, form

- Plan and design a sculpture
- Use tools and materials to carve, add shape, add texture and pattern
- Develop cutting and joining skills, e.g. using wire, coils, slabs and slips

Key vocabulary: form, structure, texture, shape, mark, soft, join, coil, slab, slip

- Add collage to a painted or printed background
- Use a range of mixed media
- Experiment with a range of media by overlapping and layering in order to create texture, effect and colour

Key vocabulary: shape, form, arrange, fix, colour, pattern, overlapping, layering.

- Design and create printing blocks/tiles
- Develop techniques in mono, block and relief printing
- Create and arrange accurate patterns

Key vocabulary: composition, printmaking, pattern, shape, tile, colour, arrange, block, relief, monoprint

- Select colours and materials to create effect, giving reasons for their choices
- Refine work as they go to ensure precision
- Learn and practice a variety of techniques, e.g. overlapping, tessellation, mosaic and montage
- Select appropriate materials, giving reasons
- Use a variety of techniques, e.g. weaving and stitching to create different textural effects
- Develop skills in stitching, cutting and joining
- To be able to create pattern and images through weaving

Key vocabulary: texture, shape, form, pattern, mosaic, pattern, line, texture, colour, shape, thread, needle, textiles, decoration, tile, weaving, warp, weft.

- Understand the concept of tessellation and how to create a tessellating pattern
- To be able to create and arrange patterns

Key vocabulary: pattern, tessellation, shape, colour

- Give detailed observations about notable artists', artisans' and designers' work
- Offer facts about notable artists', artisans' and designers' lives
- Use inspiration from famous artists to create a piece of work in a similar style
- Express an opinion on the work of famous, notable artists and refer to techniques and effect
